There are the 8 **be** verbs that are easy as can be:

 am, is are – was and were – be, being, and been,  
 am, is are – was and were – be, being, and been.

There're 23 helping verbs, and I've recited only 8.  
 That leaves fifteen more that I must relate:  
 has, have, and had – do, does, and did,  
 has, have, and had – do, does, and did,  
 might, must, may – might, must, may.

Knowing these verbs will save my grade:  
 can and could – would and should,
